Harry was a dedicated supporter of Army Aviation while on Active Duty and as a Contractor. Those of us who knew and worked with him over the years will miss him greatly.

Harry began his military career in 1963, serving more than 24 years until his retirement in 1988 as a command sergeant major. His entire military career was dedicated to U.S. Army aviation. He served two tours of duty in Vietnam, Germany, Korea and Central America. He was a lifetime member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Retired Sergeants Major & Chiefs Association, Association of the United States Army, and the Army Aviation Association of America.

After retirement, he was employed with DynCorp International, LLC, where he was responsible for executive direction, management control and coordination of multiple aviation contracts within the United States.

He served in numerous positions of responsibility both in the United States and overseas. During Operation Desert Shield/Desert Storm, he served as DynCorp's director of operations in Saudi Arabia,

where he was responsible for establishing and managing a contract field team of more than 500 personnel providing flexible and responsive aviation maintenance support to the U.S. Army in the southwest Asia area of operations. In recognition of his efforts, he was awarded the Department of the Army's Outstanding Civilian Service Medal and the Army Aviation Association of America's Material Readiness Award for contributions by an individual member or industry.
